



## RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Job satisfaction among the teachers of different faculties :

**Table 1 : Job satisfaction among the teachers of different faculties.**

Veterinary	72.13	Agriculture Vs Dairy 0.91 NS

As evident from Table-1, differences in the mean job satisfaction scores between agriculture - veterinary, agriculture-dairy and veterinary - dairy science faculties, teachers were found to be non-signifi-

cant. The probable reason for each findings is that the teachers employed in all three faculties of university are governed by the same rules.

**Table 2 : Job satisfaction among different categories of teachers.**

It could be seen from Table 2 that there was a significant difference in the mean job satisfaction scores between Professors-Associate Professors and Professors-Assistant Professors. However, non-significant difference in job satisfaction was observed between Associate Professor and Assistant Professor. The finding is in confirmity with those reported by Singh *et al.* (1977) and Mahurkar (1981).

## CONCLUSIONS

It was concluded that there was no significant difference in the mean job satisfaction scores of teachers working in agriculture, veterinary and dairy science faculties of GAU, Anand Campus.

It was revealed that the significant differences was observed in the mean job satisfaction scores of Professors-Associate Professors, Professors-Assistant Pofessors of GAU, Anand Campus.
